

For the last two weeks we have been practising to read words with the **i-e**, **o-e** and **u-e split digraphs** in. These are words where the 'e' at the end of the word makes the vowel that comes before it, say its letter name.

Below are a list of words that contain these letter combinations. Please ask your child to read a small selection of them each day as well as selecting some for them to spell. Remind them to say the word and then segment it into it's individual sounds before they write it
